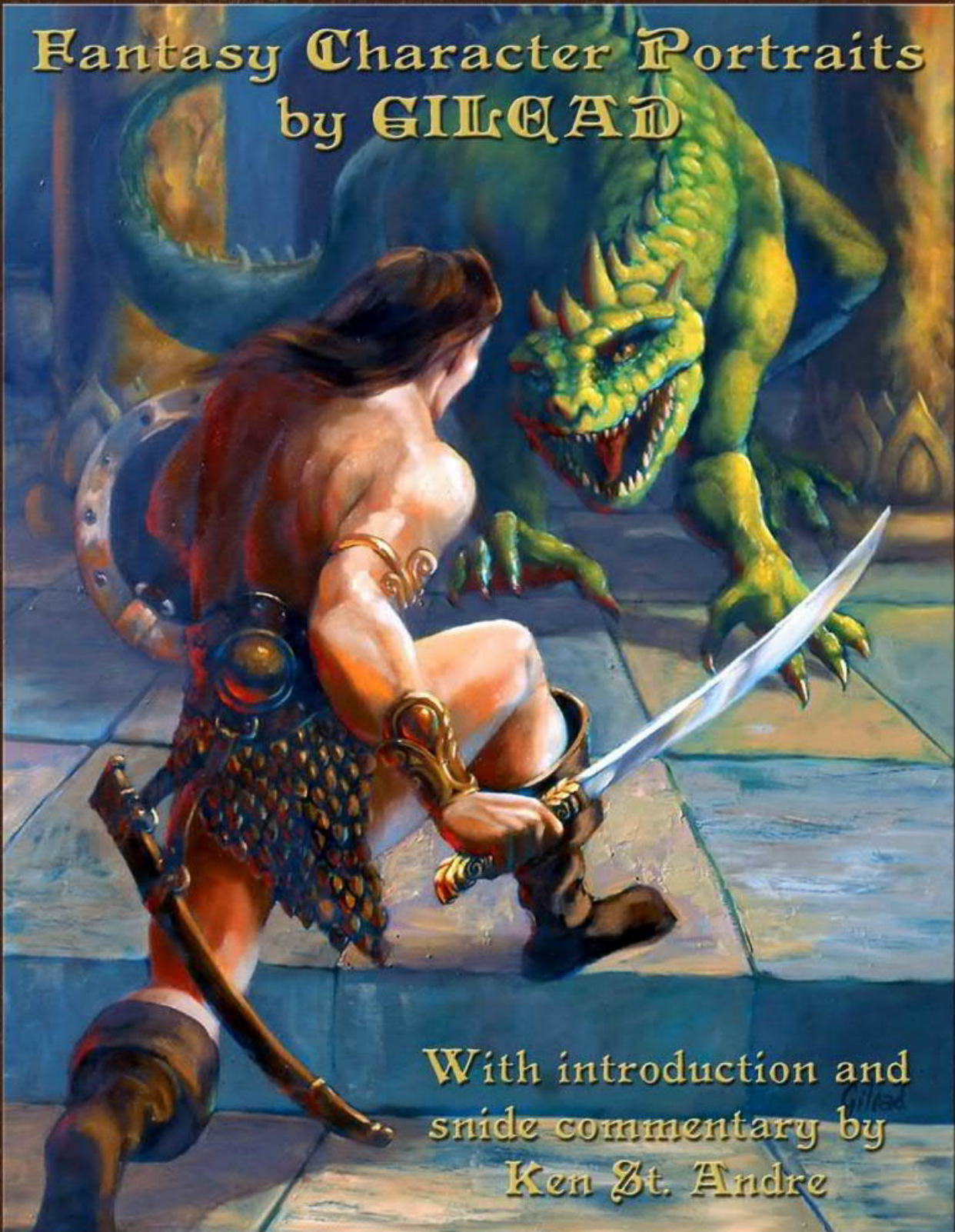

fielder in the game.





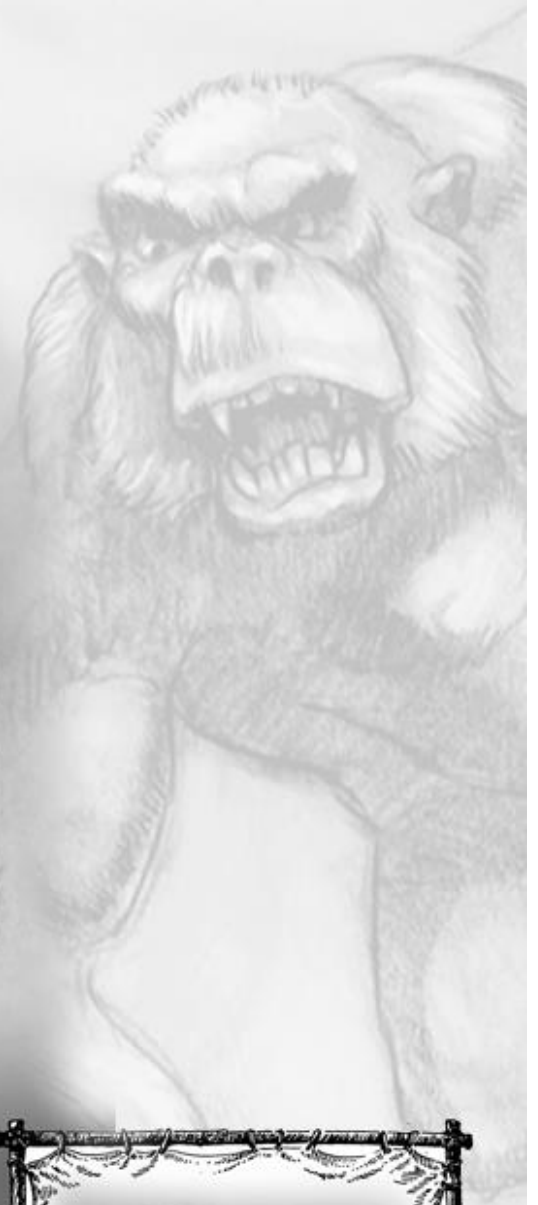
Regretfully Ivorna went in quest

couldn't stay out of it.



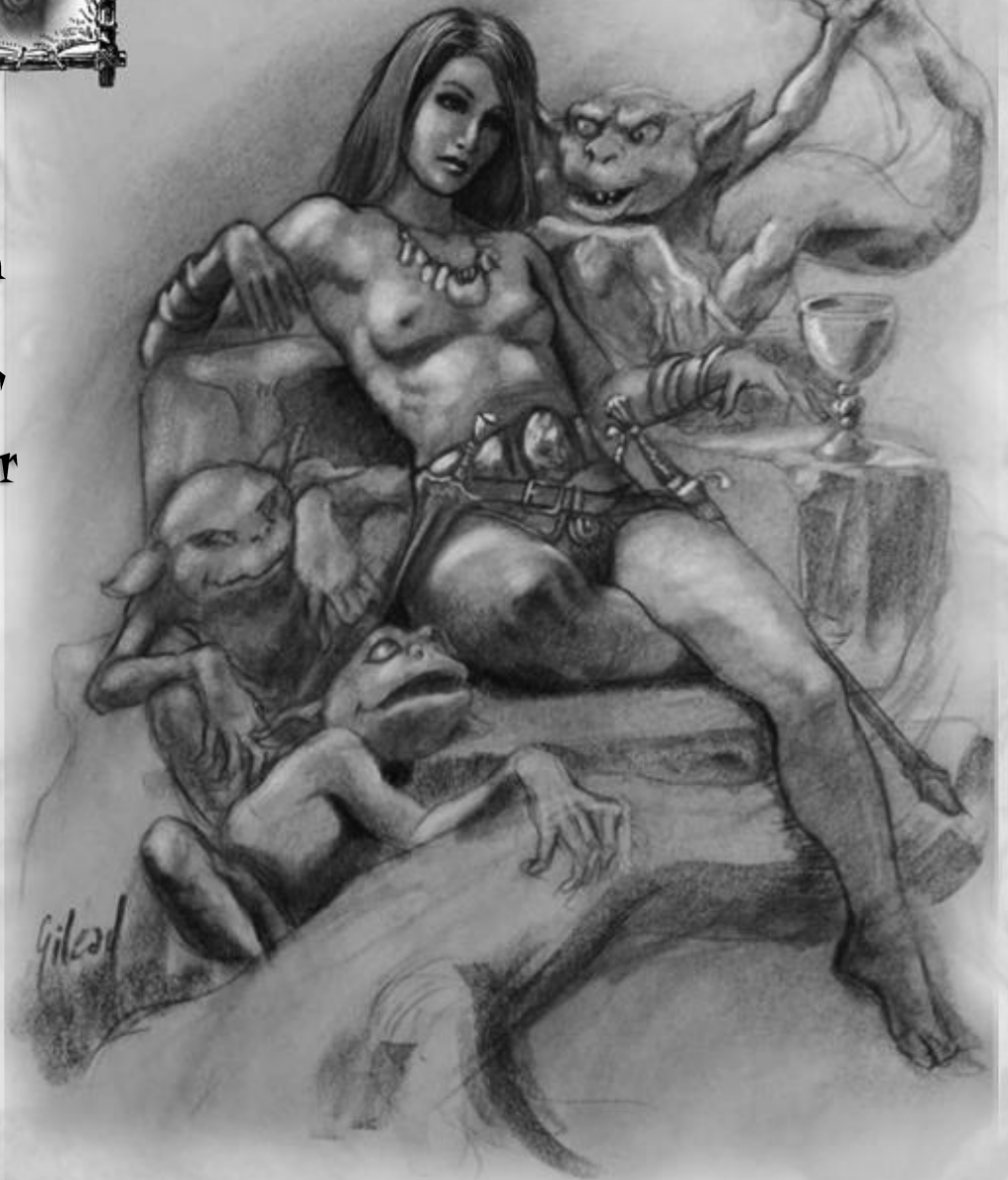
