1	Idrium is a rare substance found on volcanic peaks. The base metal is not valuable, but if lightning strikes it, Idrium becomes extremely resilient and durable, making it a perfect material for armor.	11	Dark Wood grows in the hearts of ancient trees, forming around and absorbing energy from intruding magical substances like pearl around sand in an oyster. Dark Wood is prized by artificers and alchemists.
2	The flesh of dead Bile Leeches decays into a gelatinous goo with unique properties. It is a deadly poison and a potent death magic reagent.	12	Spotted Slugs feed on plants that grow in salty, coastal marshes. They exude acidic slime, and their rubbery flesh has potent medicinal properties.
3	No one knows if Glex Pods are animal, vegetable, or something else entirely. These flexible glistening spheres appear in many different environments. The glowing gasses they contain are powerful elemental reagents.	13	Sifting sand on isolated tropical beaches uncovers Shard Bugs, tiny filter feeders with crystalline shells that conduct energy. Magic users need hundreds of bugs to create wands or staves that project electrical effects.
4	The deepest dungeons are home to Amorphites, sentient oozes that randomly alter whatever they touch. Their gooey flesh is a source of magical transmutation energy.	14	Bone Beetles feed on dead flesh. When that flesh is undead, they accumulate magical energies in their shells priests can use to enhance the power of unholy weapons.
5	Deer Killer Wasps lay eggs on their furry namesakes. The eggs hatch into hungry maggot-like larvae that feed on their host. The larvae are considered a weird and wonderful delicacy in some places.	15	Fish Hair Weed grows in the depths of cold northern lakes. The long white stems of this plant are incredibly strong and light. Fabric woven from this material is used to make magical clothing.
6	Blackthorn is a scrubby bush that grows in dry, sandy deserts. Mixing the pulverized spines of this plant with molten iron or steel enhances the metal's strength and resilience.	16	When lava expelled from active volcanoes lands in water, it sometimes forms Magmatic Crystals. When properly cut and shaped, these stones hold vast quantities of magical energy.
7	The mighty Shagneedle Fir grows in rainy temperate forests and reaches heights of 600 feet. The tiny seed cones it produces add a piquant flavor to meat or fish.	17	Luma is fungal matter harvested from deep-cave mushrooms. When crushed, it glows with a bright orange-yellow light. Powdered Luma is used in many potion recipes.
8	Fist-sized nodules of Duhexium form around magical hot springs and volcanic vents. Dissolving nodules in whale oil and soaking clay in the resultant liquid creates a potent, but unstable, explosive.	18	Dreamvine grows on temperate plains, winding between the stems of prairie grass. It only blooms after intense thunderstorms. Apothecaries use flower petals from this plant to make a potent soporific.
9	Treating leather goods and textiles with Tanger's Oil makes them water-repellent and enhances their durability. Unfortunately, the unrefined oil must be harvested from the scent glands of poisonous jungle lizards.	19	Wood from Soul Eater Trees retains the life essence of creatures consumed by the carnivorous plant. This iron-hard material can create a spiritual bond between a weapon or tool and a particular individual's bloodline.
10	Elusive Ice Tigers live on remote mountain peaks in the far north. Their Shimmerhide is valued for its beautiful silver and white color and its affinity for illusion magic.	20	When powdered and combined with other ingredients, Dry Bone Fungus, which grows on corpses left exposed in desert environments, restores health and may halt or reverse aging.
